TEMPLE HIGH SCHOOL JAZZ BANDS Spring 2022 News!

In January of 2022, the Temple High School Jazz Bands traveled to Dallas, TX to participate in the Jazz Education Network national conference. Three groups, the Wildcat Jazz Combo, Temple Blues, and Temple Highlighters performed in the JENerations Jazz Festival. Each ensemble received constructive feedback and clinics from world-class clinicians that included **Scott Wilson** (Univ. of Florida),

Brad Lindee (Washington D.C. saxophonist), Ingrid Jensen (Maria Schneider Orchestra), Ashley Shabankareh (JEN Board of Directors VP), Brian MacDonald (USAF Airmen of Note), and John Beasley (MONK'estra). The Temple Highlighters were joined on stage by Highlighter alums Altin Sencalar and Jeremy Langthorn.

On February 19 and 20, the Temple Highlighters were a featured ensemble in the big band category in the 14th annual Charles Mingus Virtual Festival. The Highlighters performed Mingus' big band arrangements





of Haitian Fight Song and Boogie Stop Shuffle. As part of the educational outreach portion of the festival. students were provided Zoom Masterclass sessions with members of the Mingus Big Band while the festival broadcasted the virtual performances to an international audience. Please

On Saturday, March 4, the Temple Highlighters traveled to Houston, TX to participate in the Essentially Ellington Regional Festival at Texas Southern University. Students were treated to masterclasses with members of the Texas Southern instrumental faculty as well as a Music Business presentation led and moderated by festival host, Vincent Gardner. Immediately following their festival performance, the Highlighters received a clinic from Jazz at Lincoln Center tenor saxophonist Walter Blanding, Jr. Students Makale Edwards and Jacob Enriquez were named outstanding soloists.

On April 22, The Temple Highlighters were named national winners of the *Perform with Mintzer* contest sponsored by Eastman Winds. The Highlighters submitted an essay and a video performance. After submissions were reviewed by the judging panel of Eastman artists **Jimmie Highsmith** and **Henry Tirfe**, the winner was announced by **Bob Mintzer** himself (view here on facebook: https://fb.watch/cyQHvAU_gh/). The Highlighters will receive a private clinic with Mr. Mintzer and he will be a featured artist with the band at a date that will be determined during the 2022-2023 school year.

Consistent Quality at the Highest Level

The Plano West Jazz **Orchestra** was selected as one of fifteen national finalists in the prestigious **Essentially Ellington** Competition and Festival. This is the fourth time and third year in a row that the ensemble has made the competition's finals. The Plano students and directors traveled to New York City to participate in the festival which took place May 5th-7th. **Preston Pierce** is director of jazz bands at Plano West Senior High School.

Acclaimed trumpeter, composer, and educator **Sean Jones** serves as artistic director and bandleader."

The COM Community Jazz Ensemble continues under the direction of **Sparky Koerner** although it has been moved from being a 'for credit' course to the Continuing Education-Lifelong Learning area. Their first concert of the year was March 8, 2022 held at Stuttgarden Tavern in the Mainland City Center. Sparky said, "I wanted to get the band off campus and bring the music to the community. We had an excellent turn-out of around 120 in audience. I believe we exposed members of the community to music they haven't listened to before. That is one of our missions in playing jazz."

Their final concert of the season was given on May 3rd. "I was disappointed that I couldn't get it scheduled in April because I always have tried to be involved in Jazz Appreciation Month" said Koerner. The May concert went back to the COM Campus with a 7:30 pm performance in the Learning Resource Center. Admission was free and open to the public. Many soloists were featured.

Jazz Camp is an exciting week featuring all things jazz including jazz theory, jazz listening, improvisation, and instrument-specific classes taught by our outstanding faculty. In addition, evening activities include jam sessions, movie nights, pool party night, and evening concerts. Students can choose to be day campers or residential campers. Guest Artist

The 2022 guest artist is the incomparable tenor saxophonist, **Chad LB**! Hailed as a "Sax Phenom" by the New York Daily News, Chad LB has toured globally as a bandleader, and with superstars ranging from **Chris Botti** to **Taylor Swift**. He has been a featured soloist with premiere ensembles like the Juilliard Jazz Orchestra, and he was formerly a prominent member of the multi GRAMMY winning Afro Latin Jazz Orchestra. At only 31-years-old, Chad has now become one of the first jazz headliners of his generation, amassing a loyal social media fan base of over 250,000 followers across platforms. Despite his demanding tour schedule, Chad continues to be a visiting artist at the renowned San Francisco Conservatory of Music, where he gives monthly masterclasses during the scholastic year. The Stan Kenton Legacy Orchestra will finally be touring again in 2023. Band leader, Mike Vax, says, "The tour will happen between April 10th and April 30th. The actual length of each tour depends on how many dates are booked. I'm looking at a wide area to start with and will pare it down as dates come in. Midwest, Texas, Central and Southeast. This message is to start a dialog to see where we can obtain the most bookings. Please get back to me if you have any interest at all. Remember that any school that books the SKLO for an evening performance, gets a FREE afternoon clinic from the whole band. We are open to any type of venue that would be interested, and yes, we also have a dance book."

Alumni from the 1956 – 1978 Stan Kenton Orchestras, plus some wonderful young new members, come together to perform for festivals, clinics, concerts, cruises and dances. The band makes tours around the United States every year. They perform some of the well-known music of the Stan Kenton Orchestra; in keeping with Stan's insistence on not just performing nostalgia-type music, they also perform fresh new material written in the Kenton style, as well as original material written by members of the Band. The band is NOT trying to be the "Stan Kenton Orchestra," but is carrying on Kenton's tradition of dedication to creative music and to jazz education.

GRANTS TO TEXAS JAZZ PROGRAMS

- 5-6 elementary/middle/intermediate
